From its inception, the Katie Piper Foundation has relied on contributions from individuals. Becky Holland's innovation has been to give a percentage of the money she receives for administering aesthetic treatments directly to Katie's Foundation and simultaneously encouraging others to do so.

This initiative came to life recently with the launch at Drakes Hotel, Brighton, and Katie was introduced to those involved in the beauty and aesthetic industry in Brighton, and the South East. After delivering a moving and amusing speech, Becky Hollands donated £2000 to the Katie Piper Foundation.

The Katie Piper Foundation is working towards the delivery of an advanced rehabilitation and burns clinic in the UK. The aim is to include residential facilities for patients that will enable them to benefit directly from treatments and from social interaction with other survivors.
